Dear Parents / Carers

ROAD CLOSURE ON GRAMPIAN WAY

Over the weekend, a car collided with the houses on Grampian Way. These houses neighbour the school site. Fortunately, nobody was seriously injured in the collision however, sadly, the houses have been rendered structurally unsound as a result of the damage caused. This poses a safety risk to the public highway and as a result Grampian Way is closed from the mini island at Swallowdale Road to The Grampian pub.

We do not underestimate the distress and disruption this incident will have caused to those directly affected by the collision and we wish to extend our thoughts and warmest wishes to all those involved.

Over the weekend, we have liaised with the police to understand the implications for school access. In order for all pupils, parents and carers to access school safely, we will not be using the main pedestrian gate on Grampian Way.

START OF THE DAY

- ✓ Everyone will need to access the school site via the side gate on Glengarry Way.
- ✓ We will open the side gate at 8:30am. Breakfast club will be open as usual.
- ✓ We ask all local families to walk to school to minimise the congestion in the local area.
- ✓ Families who travel into Sinfyn, in order for their children to attend school, should aim to park away from the surrounding streets and then walk to the side gate on Glengarry way.

END OF THE DAY

In order for all pupils, parents and carers to access school safely, we will not be using the main pedestrian gate on Grampian Way.

- ✓ We will only use the side gate on Glengarry Way.
- ✓ We will open the side gate at 2:55pm and start dismissing children whose parents and carers arrive from 3:00pm.
- ✓ We ask all local families to walk to school to minimise the congestion in the local area.
- ✓ Pupils who have permission to walk home will be dismissed at 3:30pm as usual. They will leave the site via the side gate.

We will update and review this access plan, in co-ordination with the police, when we are back in school tomorrow.
